

## **Law and Order in Singapore**

Singapore laws are strictly enforced, often with severe punishments. You must abide by all Singapore laws. Violation of any law could lead to a heavy fine or more serious punishment. STP holders could also have their Student's Pass terminated.

### **Illegal Drugs**

Singapore has a mandatory death penalty for anyone convicted of possessing, manufacturing, trafficking or distributing prescribed quantities of illegal drugs.

You face 10 year's imprisonment and/or a S\$20,000 fine for consumption of illegal drugs

### **Littering**

Singapore has strict laws against littering. This includes dropping cigarette butts.

You face a fine of up to S\$1000 for a first offence. Repeat offenders can be fined S\$2000 and are subject to a Corrective Work Order.

### **Other**

Student's Pass holders are not permitted to do paid work of any kind at any time in Singapore.

It is an offence to download any material with political, religious or other content which may be regarded as 'causing public mischief'.

Similarly, it is an offence to post material on social media sites that is likely to cause public mischief.

It is illegal to access overseas gaming sites or pornographic websites from Singapore.

The import, possession and sale of chewing gum are banned.

Jaywalking is an offence. Pedestrians are required to use the designated crossing points and respect crossing signals.

You are not allowed to eat or drink on board trains or buses, or in stations.

It is illegal for students age 18 and below to smoke. Smoking in Singapore is also restricted to specified approved areas.
